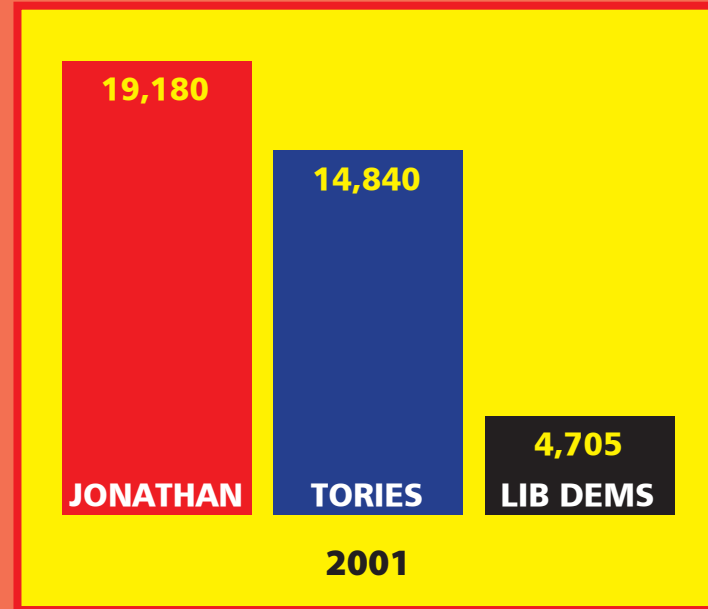


THE LIB-DEMS CAN'T WIN HERE
